## AFRICAN HERITAGE MONTH SEPTEMBER 2024

The State of Maryland is proud to be home to a rich and diverse population, whose cultural heritage strengthens and enriches our communities; WHEREAS.

WHEREAS,

On September 10, 1969, The Organization of the African Unity met in Addis Ababa and signed a treaty entitled Convention Governing the Specific Aspects of Refugee Problems in Africa to address "the constantly increasing number of refugees in Africa and desirous of finding ways and

Ten percent of Marylanders are African-born and African immigrants have made significant contributions to the culture and social fabric of WHEREAS, Maryland, shaping our state in innumerable ways through their creativity, leadership, and entrepreneurship; and

means of alleviating their misery and suffering as well as providing them with a better life and future"; and

Maryland is home to the fourth largest share of African immigrants in the country and African Immigrant Heritage Month is an opportunity to WHEREAS, honor and celebrate the rich heritage and culture of Africans, acknowledging their ingenuity, achievements, and enduring spirit; and

Nearly one in five immigrants in Maryland are from Africa and the recognition of African Immigrant Heritage Month encourages all WHEREAS, Marylanders to learn more about the significant contributions and the varied cultures of Africans across this state, thus fostering greater understanding and appreciation; and

WHEREAS; The State of Maryland reaffirms its commitment to promoting equality, justice, and inclusion for all while recognizing and honoring African immigrants as an integral part of our collective history and future; and

In 2015, H.RES.371 was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives to establish the month of September as African Immigrant Heritage WHEREAS,

Month; and in 2022, the U.S. Senate passed S.5006 to designate the month of September as African Diaspora Heritage Month; and

The African Immigrant Community is making significant contributions in education, armed forces, healthcare, arts and culture, government, WHEREAS, community service, public policy, sports, foreign affairs, entrepreneurship, advocacy, economic development, and progress in the state of

Maryland, and the United States.
