Governor Moore's Work

Throughout Governor Moore's first term in office, he has prioritized growing economic mobility and opportunity for Maryland's working families, including Latino families. The Administration has made historic investments in public education, health equity and public safety to help protect Latino communities. As the son of an immigrant, Governor Moore is committed to protecting and strengthening immigrant families amid attacks from bad actors in Washington.

Impacts for Marylanders

96,000 Latino Children

Expanded and invested in Maryland Meals for Achievement program to provide over 96,000 Latino children with free school meals this year.

26,700 Latino Workers

Raised the minimum wage to \$15 an hour, raising wages for nearly 26,700 Latino workers across the state, contributing to one of the lowest unemployment rates across the country.

\$10 Billion

Governor Moore has made record investments in public schools investing nearly \$10 billion, which will support the more than 210,000 Latino students enrolled in public schools across our state.

\$50 Million

\$50 million in grant awards to support vacant property reduction efforts in Baltimore City through the Baltimore Vacants Reinvestment Initiative.

Access To World-Class And Affordable Health Care



Maintained health care for more than 280,000 Latino Marylanders across the state, expanded Maryland Medicaid to provide 12-months of comprehensive postpartum care, and lowered costs of prescription drugs through the Maryland Prescription Drug Affordability Board, helping Latino Marylanders get the medicine they need at a low price.

Creating Safer Communities For Latino Marylanders



In order to reduce gun violence among young people in our communities, the Moore-Miller Administration launched The Thrive Academy to expand intervention and rehabilitation services to youth who are most at-risk to be victims or perpetrators of gun violence. Since October of 2023, Thrive has served 165 youth, 92% being youth of color and nearly 11% are Latino.

Protecting And Uplifting Immigrant Communities



allocated \$5 million to help immigrant Marylanders thrive, including establishing support infrastructures and connecting individuals to SNAP, Medicaid, TCA, and WIC. Governor Moore is fighting to uphold the Constitution and protect all Maryland families, including immigrant families.
